

Uniform Policy

At Korea Foreign School, we believe in the importance of the school uniform as a means of encouraging students to feel a sense of pride and purpose. School uniform contributes to the ethos of the school, and it is the responsibility of all students to ensure that students are correctly dressed and look smart and formal at all times. Also, uniforms are an excellent way to unite our students, while bringing ease to deciding what to wear to school in the morning.

Uniform dress is expected to be worn by all students each day from Monday - Friday. All uniforms must be neat and clean. Students should practice good hygiene and take pride in their appearance. Hair must be completely groomed prior to arrival at school.

If a student is out of uniform or violates uniform policy or dress code in any way, the student's parents will receive a courtesy call or e-mail home. Repeated violations of the uniform policy will result in a parent conference to obtain more information.

There are exceptions to KFS' Uniform Policy only for special events or occasions. For example, students are required to wear their PE uniform for all field trips unless otherwise advised. Likewise, for school events, like Spirit Week and International Day, we encourage students to wear themed or cultural-based outfits. On these days, student must still abide by the additional dress code restrictions.

Required Uniform

For their formal uniform, students have the choice between wearing the long-sleeved or short-sleeved version of a button-down polo shirt. The boys' shirts have a columbian blue base with a maya blue accent stripe along the collar.

Contrastingly, the girls' shirts are magenta pink with an accent stripe of fuchsia pink. All of our tops sport an embroidered school logo. On colder days, the students have a smart blue and white button down cardigan sweater to keep them warm. If they are cold, students must wear this cardigan and not a different jacket that is not part of the school uniform.

The bottoms are made with a dressy dark navy fabric. Both boys' and girls' pants have a single pleated front, which makes these pants comfortable while looking smart. Girls have the choice between wearing the six pleated skirt or pants to school. If girls choose to wear a skirt, they must wear opaque, black or navy-colored tights.

On Physical Education days, students have a fun and comfortable track suit to wear for maximum ease of movement in the class. The three piece set includes pants, a jacket, and shirt. The boys' set is accented with three light blue stripes down each side of the pant leg and down the arms on the jacket, with stitched Korea Foreign School lettering across the back, whereas the girls' is accented with light pink.

The following dress code restrictions are also enforced:

Hairstyles

- Excessive hairstyles are not allowed
- Unnatural tints of hair (i.e. blue, pink, purple, etc.) are prohibited.
- Designs of any kind in hair or eyebrows are not allowed.

Makeup

- Makeup is strictly prohibited (this also includes face paint or other makeup for events like Spirit Week).
- No body glitter will be allowed.

Jewelry

- Oversized and excessive amounts of jewelry are prohibited.
- Dangling earring are prohibited for safety reasons.
- Body jewelry of any kind is not allowed.
- Only female students may wear stud earrings.

Nails, Tattoos, and Hats

- Students may not wear false nails, including acrylic or press-on nails.
- Students may not wear nail polish. Painted nails go against school dress code.
- Tattoos are prohibited.
- Hats must be removed before entering the school building. (Exceptions include field trips and school events, like Spirit Week and International Day.)
